


Dear Haute Router,


You are about to embark on a unique adventure: the Haute Route! We hope you are as motivated and excited as we are to welcome you this summer.

WHAT TO TAKE WITH YOU?

To assist you in your preparation for the Haute Route, here is what you need to pack with you when preparing your luggage.

Mandatory equipment

- Road bike in excellent condition
- ✓ Hard-shell helmet
- Cleated cycling shoes
- Leggings
- ✓ Long gloves
- Rad rear light fitted to the bike used in the race
- ✓ Identity card / passport if traveling internationally / Visa
- Water bottles

- ✓ Sunglasses with interchangeable lenses (sun/cloud)

- Leg warmers or thermal tights
- Cycling cap/headband/buff
- Socks

CHEF DE FILE

What is the story behind the brand Chef de File?

Founded in 2017 by two former high-level cyclists with a passion for the sport, Chef de File is a French brand specializing in the design of high-end cycling apparel.

Driven by a commitment to quality and a keen eye for detail, its founders aimed to combine technicality, comfort, and aesthetics in each of their creations. Inspired by French elegance and the heritage of cycling, the brand offers a unique approach: that of demanding, refined, and modern cycling.

As the official textile partner of La Haute Route, Chef de File supports cyclists in their quest for performance with apparel that is both innovative and distinctive.

We have unveiled the jersey for the Haute Route 2025 edition, what is the story behind this jersey?

This jersey was born from a discussion about the DNA of the Haute Route: a demanding event, but also refined and modern.

From the start, the idea was to offer a clean, elegant design with a creative touch inspired by the mountains, directly linked to the territories crossed.

We envisioned a simple visual, structured by gradients and geometric shapes reminiscent of alpine landscapes, while maintaining strong readability. The iconic orange of the Haute Route was retained for the logos, to stay true to the event's identity.

How did you conceive, create, and produce the jersey?

For the Haute Route, we designed an exclusive jersey, directly inspired by our premium collections, to offer participants a product that meets the demands of this event. Imagined in France by our design studio, this jersey was crafted in our own workshop, the Chef de File Factory, located in the Community of Valencia, Spain, ensuring traceability, control, and quality.

From a more technical perspective, what is the composition of the jersey?

This jersey is made from ultra-light and breathable materials, positioned at the front and back to promote quick drying and optimal comfort, even during long summer rides. The sleeves feature a particularly airy fabric, designed for maximum ventilation. Its fitted cut, without side panels, has been meticulously studied to reduce the number of seams to the bare minimum, offering a remarkable second-skin effect, combining performance and a sense of freedom.

This year, you decided to produce a range of Haute Route merchandise, can you tell us about it?

For this edition, we wanted to offer a more complete range of merchandise to support participants before, during, and after the event.

The main graphic design has been adapted for the long-sleeve jersey and the sleeveless wind vest. For the rest of the range – gloves, socks, bib shorts, cap, arm warmers, neck warmer, and water bottle – we opted for a more understated and elegant approach, with a color palette focused on dark blue, black, white, and of course, the Haute Route orange. The goal is to offer complementary, functional, and aesthetic pieces that riders can easily mix and match or wear independently, while staying within the Haute Route universe.

Will you be present throughout the event? Where can we find you?

We will be present at various stages of the event to support participants closely. You can find us in Megève, the day before the grand start, as well as at the finish of the first stage. We will also be present in Nice, at the finishes of the sixth and seventh stages, to celebrate together the demand, elegance, and passion of cycling.

MAVIC

What will be your role during the event?

For 14 years, we have been assisting participants throughout the Haute Route, particularly during two main moments: during each stage of the race and at the finish village.

What is your scope of action? What can you intervene on?

We assist all participants with technical issues: brake bleeding, derailleur adjustments, flat tires, breakages, and parts replacement.

On August 23rd, the bib collection will take place. Will you be present to help participants assemble their bikes or address any difficulties?

Obviously, we will have four technicians present from the opening bib collection of the help participants assemble their bikes. make adjustments, and perform checks if needed.

Where can participants find you during the stages? Are you on the course or present at strategic points?


We will be present every morning before the start of each stage, and then we will have two cars and one truck on the course at different points of the race. In the evening, we will be at the village with our large workshop truck.

If a participant encounters a technical problem during a stage, how can they contact you? How will you intervene?

First, the participant must stop and inform a motorcyclist (safety moto) to report their position. Once their position is known, we will reach them to provide assistance and carry out the necessary repairs.

Is the Mavic assistance free for participants? Under what conditions might they have to pay for something?

The Mavic assistance service is entirely free throughout the event. The only exception is if a participant needs to replace a part on their bike; the part will be chargeable and at the participant's expense.



BAGS LOGISTICS

TRAVEL BAG

This is the only bag transported by our team, from hotel to hotel. During bib collection, you must pack all your belongings into the travel bag (100L).

If you have chosen accommodation with the Haute Route, each morning, drop off your travel bag at the hotel reception in the designated area, and the porters will transport it to your next hotel.

If you have not chosen accommodation with the Haute Route, you need to drop off your travel bag at the start line and then pick it up at the finish village.

BACKPACK

This bag is given to all participants. With a size of 25L, it is useful for storing your last-minute items just before the start.

The backpack should be dropped off by all participants at the start line in the designated area with our teams.

It will be transported to the finish line where you can retrieve it.

RACE BAG

This bag will be provided only to those who selected the race bag service option during their registration.

This bag allows you to store spare clothing (for warm or cold weather) and/or your own supplies (drinks, food). It should be dropped off at the start line in the designated area with our teams.

You will find your race bag at a predetermined location and then at the finish line.


